BOOKS:

THE BIBLE OF ILLUMINATED LETTERS: A treasury of Decorative Calligraphy, by Margaret Morgan. Visual references and alphabets. Highly recommend if you are interested in the medieval style.

HORTUS EYSTETTENSIS: The Bishop's Garden and Besler's Magnificent Book, by Nicolas Barker. The painting and calligraphy in this reprint of a 1613 book by the apothecary / botanist Basilius Besler are a treasure of inspiration. This was before most hybridization of plants and I have enjoyed comparing these plants to those in my own garden and studying the calligraphic hands he employs.

PATTERN DESIGN, by Lewis F. Day - a classic from the era when everything was hand done. This book will help you understand the elements of doing a repeat, whether you're doing an original or working on a computer.

ARTHUR BAKER'S HISTORIC CALLIGRAPHIC ALPHABETS- A Dover book with excellent large exemplars.
